Albert Bradbeer Primary Academy COVID Catch Up Implementation Plan - Phonics in Year 2



Problem (why?)

82% of children in Year Iwere on track to meet the phonic standard by the end of year 1, compared to 83% national

82% of disadvantaged pupils were on track to meet the threshold

A large percentage of these pupils have not consistently accessed work at home and early indications on their return to school are that they will require a good level of intervention to meet the threshold by the end of this term.

Intervention Description (what?)

Additional teaching of phonics 2 mornings per week in a 1-1 situation focused towards disadvantaged pupils.

This will be delivered by an additional member of staff who is already trained in delivering Read, Write Inc.

This member of staff will also work closely with parents to support additional catch up activities at home

Cost £200 per week for the duration of the Autumn Term and Spring 1 - £2400

(Year 1 teacher currently works 3 days per week. Additional day to work with Year 2 children on 1:1 phonics)

Implementation Activities (how?)

Baseline the children to establish the gaps in their phonic knowledge. Use this information to group the children accordingly and plan interventions

Use existing RWI Assessments to establish a baseline

Homogenous groups taught daily for phonics.

Additional phonic sessions carried out 1:1 for identified children

Implementation Outcomes (how well?)

Short term

Children will be identified for the catch-up intervention support.

Consistently good or better teacher sourced and appointed with RWI experience.

Medium term

Monthly assessments will demonstrate progress being made by targeted children.

(These are RWI Assessments)

Focused set sounds will be identified and shared with parents; engaging them in the children's learning.

Long term

Disadvantaged pupils will achieve the same outcomes as other pupils

Pupils who have been identified for intervention will make accelerated progress and there will be no gaps.

Phonic results for Autumn Term will

Final Outcomes (and so?)

The percentage of pupils achieving the threshold for the phonics screening test will be above National Average.

Disadvantaged pupils will achieve the same as others

Children will have caught up by the time they reach Year 3
