How it works...

Each activity is worth one stamp in your Children's University Passport to Learning, to receive your stamps you must provide evidence that you have completed the activity to your teacher in school. This could be a photograph or a written summary of what you did and the materials you used.

<p>Activity 1</p> <p>Environmental Challenge</p> <p>Create a recycling plan for your family to use in your home. Find out what your local council policy is for recycling and help your family recycle waste on a weekly basis.</p> <p>You could introduce colour coded waste collection, or help your family realise why recycling is important to the environment.</p>	<p>Activity 2</p> <p>Cooking Challenge</p> <p>If you were in the junior bake off what would your 'show stopper' be? Search online with your family, or use a family cookbook to source a cake recipe.</p>	<p>Activity 3</p> <p>Create a Spring poem, think about the changing seasons, what do you love about Spring?</p> <p>You could write about the changing colour of the leaves, the blossom or even about the changes you notice with animals.</p>
<p>Activity 4</p> <p>Kindness Challenge</p> <p>Design bookmarks that promote and encourage kindness. Give a bookmark to brighten someone's day! You could give a bookmark to your friends, family, teachers. We'd love to see some finished bookmarks.</p>	<p>Activity 5</p> <p>Nature Challenge</p> <p>Make a bird feeder out of recycled materials. The RSPB has a great activity to make your own feeder - https://www.rspb.org.uk/fun-and-learning/for-kids/games-and-activities/activities/make-recycled-bird-feeder/</p>	<p>Activity 6</p> <p>Photograph Challenge</p> <p>Can you go outside into the garden or local park and snap your best wildlife picture.</p>



<h3>Activity 7</h3> <h4>Recommend a book</h4> <p>We want to produce an University of Wolverhampton Children's University 'must read' list. Write a book review for your favourite book, tell us what you liked, who you think would enjoy the book and what age the book is for? I can't wait to hear some of the recommendations.</p>	<h3>Activity 8</h3> <h4>Environmental Challenge.</h4> <p>Design a computer game based on saving the planet or doing something positive for the environment. Create the main characters and a story board of how your game can be played.</p> <p>What key messages do you want other children to learn from the game?</p>	<h3>Activity 9</h3> <h4>Cooking Challenge</h4> <p>Store Cupboard Challenge. With support of your family take a look at what you have in your food cupboards and design a meal based around what you have at home. With support, create your own 'Store Cupboard Surprise'</p>
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<h3>Activity 10</h3> <h4>Performers Challenge.</h4> <p>With your friends, brothers or sisters create a play to show your family. Think about the storyline, the characters, costumes and the script. Encourage everyone to take part and have fun!!</p>		<h3>Activity 11</h3> <h4>Easter Challenge</h4> <p>Get creative and decorate your own egg! How creative can you get? Remember to take a photo and send it to your class teacher</p>
<h3>Activity 12</h3> <h4>Easter Bonnet Challenge.</h4> <p>Create your own 'Eggcellent' Easter hat! (This is Mr Marshall's attempt at humour!!!)</p>	<h3>Activity 13</h3> <h4>Family Challenge.</h4> <p>Design a board game with the theme of friendship and kindness for you to play with your family. Create questions, playing pieces and don't forget the rules!</p> <p>Encourage your family to play it with you.</p>	<h3>Activity 14</h3> <h4>Thinking of others Challenge.</h4> <p>Learn the British Sign Language Finger Spelling alphabet and record yourself signing your name.</p>



<p>Activity 15 Story challenge</p> <p>Create a 'story of you' and write about all of the things that are important to you. Do you have anything you find hard? What special talents do you have? What has your biggest success been? What would you like to achieve in the future?</p>	<p>Activity 16 COLOUR CHANGING FLOWERS</p> <p>Why not pick different flowers that are blooming at the moment and use different things such as food die or felt pens to dye them and change colours.</p>	<p>Activity 17 Songs challenge</p> <p>Create a playlist to uplift your mood. We would like you to find 30 songs, in total: 10 songs that make you happy; 10 songs that inspire you and 10 songs that calm you. Turn that list into a poster to keep on a wall or share with us so we can spread happiness and calm around the country!</p>
<p>Activity 18 Creativity</p> <p>Why not have an Easter party and make a piñata! This can be a decoration filled with all your favourite treats!
